For a long time animals have been an object of the experiments conducted by people. People consider that they work for the sake of the whole humanity, and the experiments should be taken. Vivisection is "the cutting of or operation on a living animal usually for physiological or pathological investigation; animal experimentation especially if considered causing distress to the subject" (Merriam Webster Dictionary). This is an ethical problem as the animals cannot give their consent to be an object of an experiment. This means that animals are used for the human future well-being. Animals are not protected as they have no right to agree or disagree in this

issue. That is why this is a duty of people to become humane and help in this difficult issue. People should understand that animal abuse is a cruel representation of their inner world. People cut live animals without sympathy; they abuse, make vaccines and treat animals as if they are not alive.

The *purpose* of my speech is to show the problem that society practices and find solutions to this problem.

The *thesis* lies in the fact that animal abuse and vivisection have obtained global scales that lead to inhumane treating of the animals in the cruel experiments.

The *problem* lies in the fact that these experiments are led as secret ones, and it is difficult to trace the abusers as they work underground.

Solution of the problem can be achieved only if people unite the groups with one purpose – to protect animals. First, they should conduct demonstration that will aim to stop the legal experiments with animals, second they are to inspire the authorities to make all efforts to find illegal groups of abusers and put them on the right trail.

According to the statistical data, the lion share of the children-related violence that is committed at home or in school starts from the animal-abusive activity. As an evidence for this statement, it is possible to consider the following examples: the case of 1999, when Dylan Klebold and Eric Harris have committed the crime - shooting at Columbine High School. The beginning of the abusive behavior has taken its place as they have mutilated the animals and furthermore – desired to get much adrenaline from their activities and made a decision of shooting in their school. One more example is Luke Woodliam, who has killed his mother and after that shot two of his classmates. Before this, Luke has 'enjoyed' the process of killing his

dog and describing her dying howls –he has considered these howls as the "thing of beauty" (Duncan et al, 2005).

I understand that the program is not easy as it needs time and efforts to awaken your attention to the problem. However, if the forces of the citizens and authorities unite, the aim will be achieved. First, the experiments will be stopped in the laboratories. Later, after some of the groups will be put on trial, this information will go to the mass media and will be spread within society. That will cut a percentage of illegal experiments, as the groups will see that the process of animal protection has been started. They will understand that it became dangerous to conduct such experiments.

My aim is to explain that each kind of abuse is dangerous for the society. Animals experience the torture, pain, danger and fear in the same manner as we do. All the above-listed factors are the things, which abuse the animal's feelings. It is hard to imagine what humans would feel in the case if they feel these fears every second or their lives.

The only difference in the current social life is that the cruel abusive actions against animals face with the minimal punishments in some cases. The law implies no legal punishment for the animal abuse. According to the Bible, animals have the equal to humans' right for the happy and abuse-free life. That is why the animal abusers should face with the harsher measures for their actions before it is too late (Rothfels, 2005).

I turn to all people in our society. This problem is ethical and everyone relates to it, independently on his or her way of life. However, the scientists are a group of people that is the most likely to join us as they are aware of the consequences of these cruel experiments that are conducted by abusers. The point of view of the scientist is very important in our group as they consider that some of the experiments are necessary for a happy future of human beings, and

they are not avoidable. According to their point of view, "not all research involving animals is torture". They have nothing against painlessly euthanized transgenic mice "after being well-cared during their short lives" (Hansen).

There is no age restriction. People of different ages can help in the issue. Children can help in the demonstration that we can awaken the authorities. Students, especially from medical institutes and universities, will be a great asset for the issue solution as this is their daily routine to deal with a great amount of experiments. The scientists are also in charge as they are aware of the scales of abuse that the animals undergo.

The authorities tried to reduce the number of abuses long ago. "The first national law to regulate animal experimentation was passed in Britain in 1876 – the Cruelty to Animals Act of 1876. This bill created a central governing body that reviewed and approved all animal use in research. After that, many countries in Europe adopted some regulations regarding research with animals" (Adams, Larson, n.d.). However, this problem needs to be solved by the unity of the authorities and people. Each member of the society is in charge for the life of the animals as they are a part of the society and should be treated correspondingly.

Independently of the gender, race, age or political status, I urge all people to pay attention to the problem as this is an ethical issue and we all are in charge of the animals. If we unite, we can save millions of animals from abuses and clean the society from the cruel people who conduct such abuses. We should always take care of the organisms that coexist together with us as they are part of the ecosystem and perform their definite function.

The other issue is ethical. Understanding of the fact that the groups of abusers take awful experiments with animals cannot slip out of our attention. The pain that the animals feel is so
